

One WASH

Our Contribution to the GTFCC Cholera Road Map



The renewed and expanded IFRC emphasis on cholera elimination

One WASH is a Global integrated approach to combine health; WASH; Nutrition and environmental sanitation in cholera 'high risk' areas.

One WASH focuses on three main actions that are closely interlinked and operate in full alignment with the Global Task Force on Cholera Control road map

- 1. Improve preparedness, early detection, and response to contain cholera outbreaks
- 2. Deliver long-term integrated WASH/Health projects to prevent cholera and reduce morbidity and mortality
- 3. Internal and external advocacy, commitment and resource mobilization



Implementing One WASH projects (typical project life span 3 to 5 years)

1. Improve preparedness, early detection and response to contain cholera outbreaks

- Preparedness/contingency plans, SOPs, trained volunteers/staff, simulations, strategic stocks of key consumables.
- Community based surveillance for early detection and monitoring.
- Community case management for early treatment (referrals, ORS-Ps)
- Prevention activities such as water treatment, hygiene and health promotion.
- Support to OCV campaigns.




Implementing One WASH project

2. A long-term integrated WASH/Health approach to prevent cholera

- Delivering sustainable long-term water, sanitation and hygiene programmes
- Integrating health and nutrition in WASH programmes
- Year-round health and hygiene behaviour change communication
- Advocacy and support to OCV campaigns when appropriate





3. Internal and external advocacy, commitment and resource mobilization

- Increased advocacy with both internal partners (RC/RC National Societies), potential external partners and fellow implementing partners.
- Coordination and partnership at local, regional and global level.
- Monitor and support projects during inception and delivery phases.
- As momentum gathers increase number of project and scale.
- Gather evidence and research on
 One WASH project impact and sustainability.



Where are we now......

- With HNS / Governments / UNICEF and other stakeholders at country level have prepared 20 One WASH concept notes so far, others in preparation.
- Initial One WASH projects now in inception period. (Ghana and Uganda to be followed by Rwanda, Malawi and Yemen)
- IFRC has mobilized 2.5 M CHF seed funding so far as we seek other funds (from both traditional and non-traditional donors)
- Seed funding is provided at country level and we encourage PNS and other donors to add to the seed findings (multilaterally or bilaterally)
