

Study Rationale

Household members of cholera patients in Bangladesh are at a 100 times higher risk of developing a cholera infection than the general population



47% Reduction in Overall Cholera Infections among Household Members in CHoBI7 Intervention Arm



Example Voice Message: Dr. Chobi



Assalamulalaikum. Dr. Chobi from the Cholera Hospital. How are you?

Have you been using the soapy water we gave you in the hospital?

Making more soapy water is easy add six capful of detergent to a plastic water bottle and then add water.

To protect your family from cholera, make sure your whole family washes their hands with soapy water after defecation or urination and before preparing, eating, or feeding children. Please tell my words to all family members.

I'll talk to you again. Take care! Keep your family healthy and happy!

Example Voice Messages: Aklima Peer Role Model



Dr. Chobi: I am with my new patient, Aklima.

Aklima, Can you tell me how to treat water using chlorine tablets?

Aklima: Yes! Add the chlorine tablet and wait 30 minutes to drink.

Dr. Chobi: Thank you Aklima! That's absolutely right!

You and Aklima are starting to become experts. Do not forget to share the text and voice messages with others in your family members!

Example Voice Messages: Aklima's Husband Peer Role Model



Dr. Chobi: How are you brother? How is Aklima and your children?

Aklima's Husband: Yes, good! My children had severe diarrhea. Now, they remain healthy.

Dr. Chobi: Why do you think they remain healthy now?

Aklima's Husband: By drinking chlorinated water and washing hands with soapy water at key times as you instructed, our children are healthy now! You called and texted us and I have shared these messages with my family and followed all the instructions.


Study Design



- 5 Hour Structured Observation of Handwashing Practices
- E.coli Counts of Household Stored Drinking Water

Findings: Five Hour Structured Observation


Hand Washing with Soap at Stool and Food Related Events 7 Day Follow-up (N=331)



OR: Odds Ratio


Findings: Stored Household Drinking Water Quality

Water Samples Less than 1 CFU/100 ml of *E.coli* 7 Day Follow-up (N=487)




Findings: Five Hour Structured Observation

Hand Washing with Soap at Stool and Food Related Events 9 Month Follow-up (N=203)



Findings: Stored Household Drinking Water Quality

WHO Very High Risk Category > 1000 CFU/100 mL of *E.coli* 9 Month Follow-up (N=376)



Summary

- •CHoBI7 mobile health program resulted in significantly higher handwashing with soap and improved water quality which was sustained at our 9 month follow-up.
- •Health facility delivery of the CHoBI7 intervention and the mobile health program alone with no home visits was sufficient to facilitate WASH behavior change.



Conclusion

•These findings demonstrate that mobile health presents a promising approach to facilitate WASH behavior change during cholera outbreaks in this

setting
