COUNTRIES

Good participation from countries at various stages of NCP development

Common threads:

- NCP is a country driven process
- Political engagement and will to go beyond single ministries
- Financing commitment to ensure sustainability
- Focus on targeting WASH interventions at hotspot level
- Need for support for NCP development:
 - Technical
 - ADVOCACY

Next steps

Pilot and validate NCP framework at country level (including budgeting tool)

NCP FRAMEWORK FINALISATION ("THE COOKBOOK")

Importance of transition from emergency (acute WASH) into long term development

- Target interventions when cholera is gone

Balance laser approach (cholera specific) vs broader angle (SDGs, other diseases)

Group 1: WASH vulnerabilities

- Systematize WASH indicators (risk factors) for hotspot analysis and NCP targeting (in collaboration with surveillance WG)
- Tasked group to work on this in the coming weeks

Group 2: Advocacy

- Importance of national advocacy, technical and political (resource mobilization)
- Advocacy tasked team



RESEARCH

Transition research into practice

Synergy with all other WGs

Need for flexibility between focussing on priorities, but also leave space for innovation and “thinking out of the box”.

Importance of “knowledge management” after the generation of the research.

Research platform

WASH AND CHOLERA TRAINING

Measuring capacity and needs at all levels

Ask partners for existing guidance and trainings

Clean up of the repository
