## SOME OF THE RECENTLY USED TRAINING PACKAGES AMONG GTFCC PARTNERS


- Epidemiology and Data Collection Methods for WASH in Emergencies (CDC, Global WASH Cluster and UNICEF)
- Water quality monitoring / microbiological testing (CDC), KAP WASH survey training (CDC)
- WASH and IPC in Cholera response (CDC/WHO/UNICEF), Integration of OCV as part of Emergency response (WHO)
- RdT and interpretation (Pasteur Institute and UNICEF)
- National Cholera Plan and multisectorial Emergency response (UNICEF and Bioforce)
- GIS and mapping of cholera (UNICEF), WaSH in Emergency including cholera response (2iE and UNICEF)
- Community based surveillance (CARE)
- Rapid Response Teams (Oxfam)

## EXISTING TRAINING PACKAGES AS COLLECTED IN THE GTFCC REPOSITORY

- 73 training materials about cholera (Courses, Case Studies, Exercises, Training Packages, Training methods)
- None of the recently used are included in the repository



## SOME OF THE ISSUES IDENTIFIED: WASH / CHOLERA TRAINING

Spine work needed it relation to collection of recently developed material / cleaning of the repository. Some thematic mapping of trainings to be done?

- Some topics may not be very well covered in the existing material:
  - · community engagement in cholera response, prevention and control
  - · community level preparedness and response planning
  - broader use of mobile technology to collect and analyse community feedback
  - understanding of socio-cultural perception on household / community level water treatment,
  - IPC measures rollout and pre-positioned at communities
  - Final safe disposal of the medical waste
  - Nutrition and health integration
  - Harmonizing hygiene promotion and cholera-specific messaging
  - ...
- Need to consider accessibility of training materials to all levels of local staff and partners, especially given move to localisation, needs of local actors etc.
- Need to consider training needs linking cholera in development WASH, outside of response where most of our capacity appears to lie.

## SOME WAYS FORWARD ON CAPACITY BUILDING PROCESS?

- Gaps and needs analysis among the WASH sector and at country level (government, local actors etc.), with a multi-sectoral lens?
- Capacity building strategy potentially prioritising RRTs and first responders health care staff?
- Role of different levels/partners in developing material and providing support for roll out (GTFCC global level, WASH working group, Cluster, regional platforms, etc)?
- Review of capacity building rolled out at key countries?
- Think about how capacity building process would / could be measured?
- Question of some GTFCC validation of "training packages" or " minimum competences"?
- Refresher trainings? Sustainability? Partnerships with local/international universities?
