Objectives:

The WASH WG meeting will be an opportunity to get an update and discuss challenges and next steps for the implementation of the *Ending Cholera Roadmap* in countries, especially with regards to the WASH pillar.

The proposed specific objectives and topics for discussion are as follows:

 - Update on the development of the “WASH Package” (i.e. set of activities and interventions to support WASH Pillar of NCPs)
 - Launch of the Investment Case – including advocacy and financing for WASH interventions
 - Update from partners on supported WASH interventions for cholera
3. To review the WASH research agenda:
 - Feedback from the “GTFCC RESEARCH AGENDA SCOPING MEETING” hosted by DFID and Wellcome Trust in London on 23-24 July 2018
 - Update from partners on research projects
 - Agreement on the WASH WG research priorities for 2019
4. To discuss and agree on the work plan and priorities for the WASH WG in 2019
