


2030 CHOLERA ROADMAP: COUNTRY DRIVEN IMPLEMENTATION ALONG 3 AXIS

- 1. Early detection and immediate response to contain outbreaks
- 2. Multi-sectoral cholera elimination interventions in targeted cholera hotspots
- 3. GTFCC partnership as a coordination and country support mechanism




From preparedness and response to prevention and control

Treating patients alone has limited impact on transmission

UNICEF engagement for support to coordination and to the investment case (health economist)




WE ARE MAKING PROGRESS...IN HAITI




WE ARE MAKING PROGRESS...IN YEMEN

WE ARE MAKING PROGRESS...IN SOMALIA







6605 cases and 45 deaths as of week 47

THE OCV CAMPAIGN AMONG ROHINGYAS IN BANGLADESH WAS A SUCCESS




WE HAD A SUCCESS IN SOUTH SUDAN



BUT NOT YET IN NIGERIA






43,990 cases and 836 deaths as of 19th Nov...

SO, WHAT COULD MAKE THE ALL STORY FAIL?

No engagement of key countries

Poor coordination and leadership at global level

Lack of in-country coordination and financing
mechanisms

Vaccines but no WaSH Lack of vaccines

WORKPLAN 2019

Support priority countries to implement the roadmap

 Would require strong capacities of GTFCC to establish and maintain in-country technical and managerial support

Improve coordination and leadership mechanisms at global level


- Adapt the GTFCC set up (platforms)
- Establish a GTFCC steering committee

Ensure strategic vaccine supply, taylored to the needs

- Ensure OCV are used at large scale, but in a strategic / preventive manner, as a trigger mechanism for sustained WaSH interventions, at least in stable countries
- Adapt the procedures accordingly

Publish and communicate on the investment case - Advocacy+++
