

Current activities Mozambique Mozambique Cholera Prevention and Surveillance (MOCA)



Study area	Cuamba District
Partners	Instituto Nacional de Saude (Ministry of Health, Mozambique)

Goal: To prevent cholera epidemics and empower local public health system for sustainable cholera surveillance and control

Key Activities:

1. OCV Campaign targeting 180,000 individuals in Cuamba

- Euvichol-plus®
- Monitoring and evaluation of campaigns (AES, coverage)

Completed Aug 2018

2. Cholera and diarrheal disease surveillance in Cuamba

- Surveillance of cholera and diarrheal diseases
- Incidences and antimicrobial resistance profiles
- Vaccine effectiveness estimation
- Phylogenetic analysis of detected strains

Ongoing

3. WASH (WaterAid)

- Formative research (Baseline/Endline surveys)
- Hygiene Behavior Change interventions

4. Health economic analysis associated with cholera

- Cost-of-illness associated with treatment of cholera patients in cholera endemic setting
- Delivery cost of OCV vaccination campaigns




Enhancing Cholera Control: ECHO-Mozambique (2020)

Goal for ECHO-Mozambique: To contribute to cholera prevention and control and facilitate development of control cholera plans in Mozambique (in context of "Ending Cholera – A Global Roadmap to 2030")

Objectives:

- 1) Conduct preventive OCV vaccination campaigns in cholera endemic hotspots
 - Lichinga/Lago District and Nampula city/Meconta District (Nampula and Niassa Provinces)
 - Vaccination campaigns (~300,000 persons total)
- 2) Strengthen the cholera and diarrheal disease surveillance and laboratory diagnostic capacity in two provinces (Niassa and Nampula)
- 3) Enhance water, sanitation, and hygiene (WaSH) in the vulnerable communities including healthcare facilities
- 4) Establish a platform for stakeholder engagement and policy discussions on national roadmap to control cholera





Enhancing Cholera Control: ECHO-Nepal (2020)

Goal: Enhance Nepal's capacity to detect, respond and prevent outbreaks of cholera

Objectives for Nepal:

- 1. Prevent cholera by delivering OCV campaigns
 in identified hot spots in Kathmandu Valley (Province 3) and Kailali District (Province 7)
- 2. Strengthen laboratory diagnostic and surveillance capacity in two sub-regions (Kathmandu Valley and Kailali District)
- 3. Strengthen Rapid Response capacity in Nepal through training of national and subnational RRT
- 4. Evaluate a dose sparing delivery strategy = Comprehensive case area Targeted Intervention (CTI) of OCV integrated with a rapid WASH response in dense urban Kathmandu (Collaboration with Mellisa Roskosky/David Sack, JHU)
- 5. Generate evidence on disease burden and effectiveness of interventions and facilitate policy development for cholera prevention and control
 - -Conduct a cross sectional serosurvey to advance understanding of disease burden and enhance disease reporting systems
