Do risk conditions merit equal weight with indicators already used in the tool?</li><li>● Can they be summed to a “Vulnerability score”?</li><li>● Should risk factors for cholera transmission be included in the Hotspot Tool or better as secondary weighting for risk or targeting of priority control measures?</li></ul> <p><b>Summary and next steps: <i>Philippe Barboza</i></b></p>
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
