



TIMELINE ELABORATION NCP FROM OUTBREAK TO RELEASE




AXIS 1: KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- 2019: Cholera cases reported to WHO almost doubled
 - Reported number deaths decreased by 36%,
 - Lowest number cases in Africa in 21st century to date
 - Lowest number of cases & deaths in Americas since 2010 (introduction Haiti).
 - ≥ 93% of cases reported globally in a single country: **Yemen**
 - Known limits of reporting


- 2019 > 23 million OCV doses shipped to 13 countries
 - ✓ Outbreak response: 14.5 Million
 - ✓ Preventive > 9 Million Doses


Countries receiving OCV in 2019



AXIS 1: 2020 — IMPACT OF COVID

- Staff repurposed to COVID
- Containment measures
- OCV Preventive campaigns postponed
- Impacts on access to health care & surveillance, WaSH, Community engagement
 - Delayed National Cholera control Plans
 - Restricted on-site support (no-travel)
 - All GTFCC Face to face meetings cancelled
 - Reactive campaigns maintained
 - Preventive campaigns implemented or resumed
 - NCP & Hotspots processes resuming
 - Likely positive impact on cholera transmission (containment, mitigation measures)


Example of impact: Covid-19 & OCV campaign 2020







AXIS 1:TOTAL OCV DOSES SHIPPED PER YEAR



Context

- OCV doses x100 in 7 years
 - ✓ **2013** >200 000 doses
 - **√ 2019** > 23 million doses

2020

- Dynamic stopped by COVID
- Impact on vaccine producers
- Successful preventive & reactive campaigns
 - √ ~8 M. doses shipped to 7 countries (to date)
 - Outbreak response: ~3.5 Million
 - Preventive Campaigns ~4.5 Million Doses
- Countries resuming preventive vaccination planning






Interim guiding document to support countries development NCPs

Cther hotspots methods used prior 2019




Launched: Zambia & Zanzibar

AXIS 3: OPERATIONAL MODEL

- Regular Steering Committee meetings held
- Independent Review Panel established
 - First review of an NCP in 2020
- Country Support Platform being launched
- Renewed GTFCC Membership
 - → 47 institutions registered (As of October 2020).



AXIS 3: CONTINUED ENGAGEMENT WITH PARTNERS



Working groups

- F2F meetings replaced by virtual meetings
 - ✓ 3 WASH WG
 - √ 3 Epidemiology WG
 - √ 2 Case management
 - √ 1 Surveillance WG
 - √ 1 OCV WG
- Virtual meetings planned in 2020
 - ✓ OCV WG
 - √ Laboratory WG



Technical guidance development

✓ In progress



- Virtual meetings will continue in 2021
- Virtual meetings cannot replace face to face meetings
- F2F meetings will be resumed when possible (COVID)

AXIS 3: HIGHLIGHTS




Advocacy, communication & reporting

- ✓ GTFCC virtual event in June 2020 (17 speakers, 237 participants from 32 countries).
- ✓ Report to the WHO Executive Board
- ✓ GTFCC statement on OCV campaigns during COVID-19



Research agenda

✓ Collaboration with Wellcome Trust & MMGH



NEXT STEPS

- Significant progresses made since GTFCC revitalisation
- Strong foundations for next steps: further operational implementation
 - ✓ Targeted & tailored implementation of multisectoral interventions in hotspots
 - ✓ Long term WASH interventions focused on hotspots still lagging behind and requires rapid scale up
 - ✓ Pace of NCPs development & implementation varies from country to country
 - ✓ Advocacy to bring on board countries not yet engaged
- Implementation of the CSP will be the next game changer

WAY FORWARD

- Support countries to implement the Roadmap & monitor implementation
- Further support hotspot analysis & targeted multisectoral interventions
- Ensure most appropriate and strategic use of OCV
- Reinforce countries surveillance capacities
 - Update surveillance minimum standard
 - Improved laboratory confirmation of cases
 - Allow tailoring strategy to context & settings
- Target hotspots for sustainable WASH interventions
 - Collect WASH data / indicators in hotspots
 - Bridge OCV & WASH
- Further integrate the different pillars
- Implementation of operational research (incl.WASH & community engagement)
