

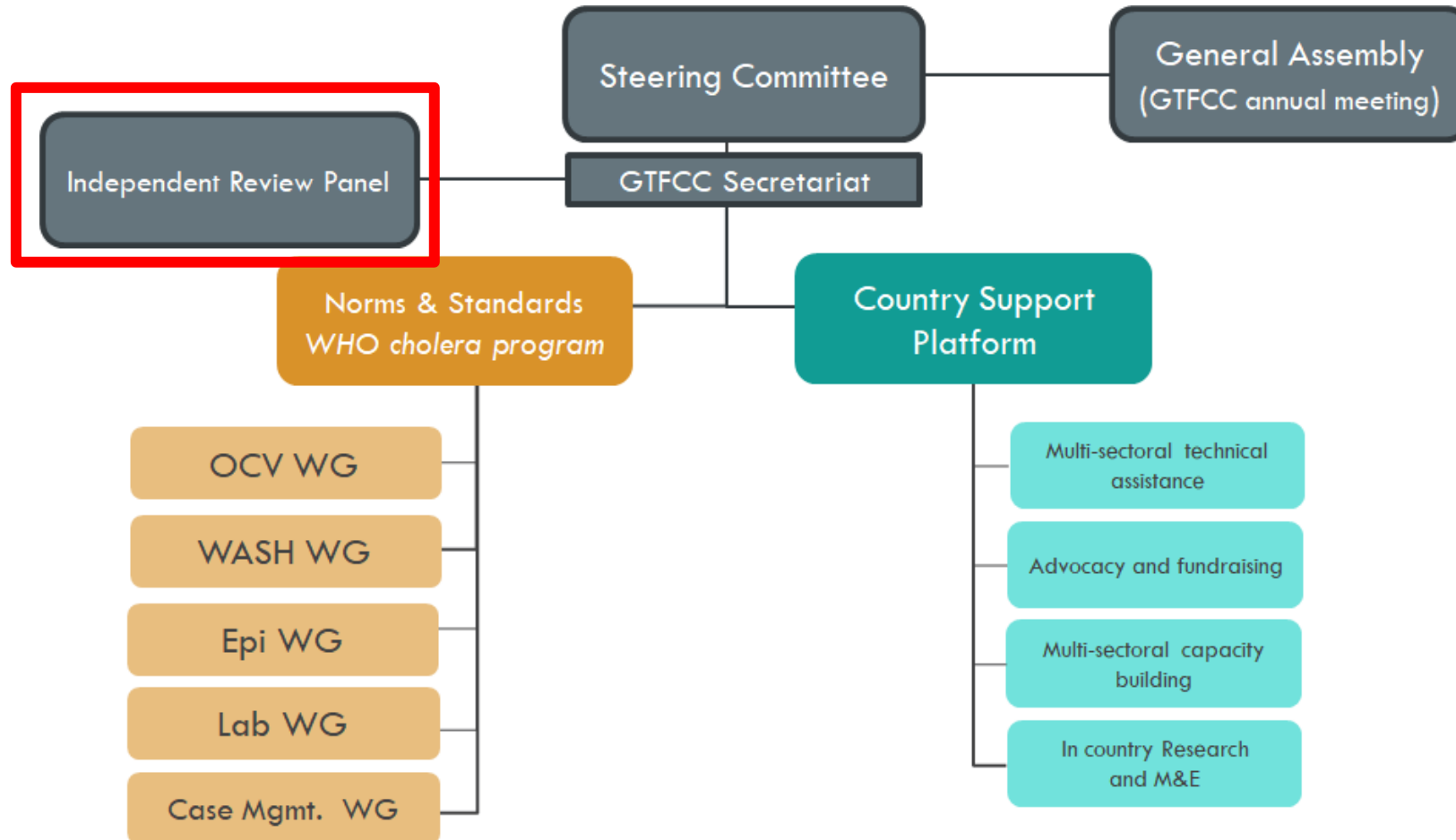

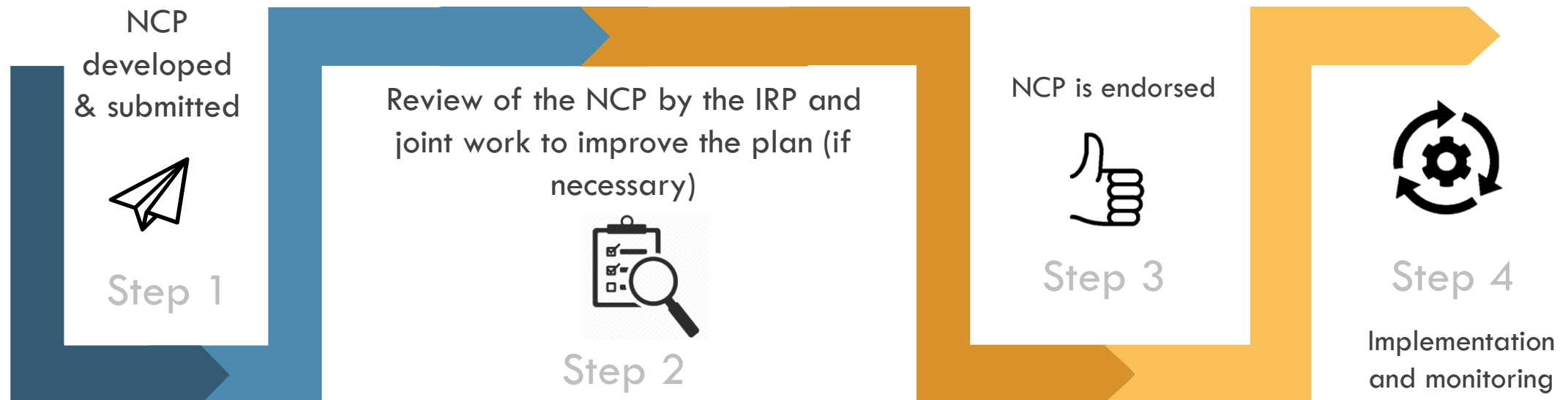

INDEPENDENT REVIEW MECHANISM



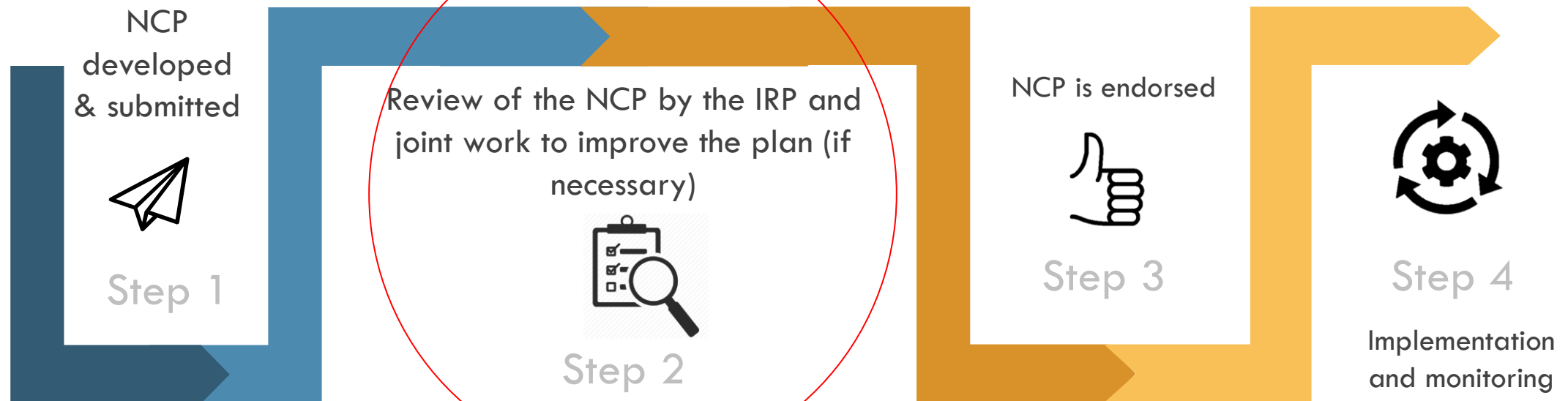
NCP REVIEW PROCESS

Collaborative process between GTFCC and countries



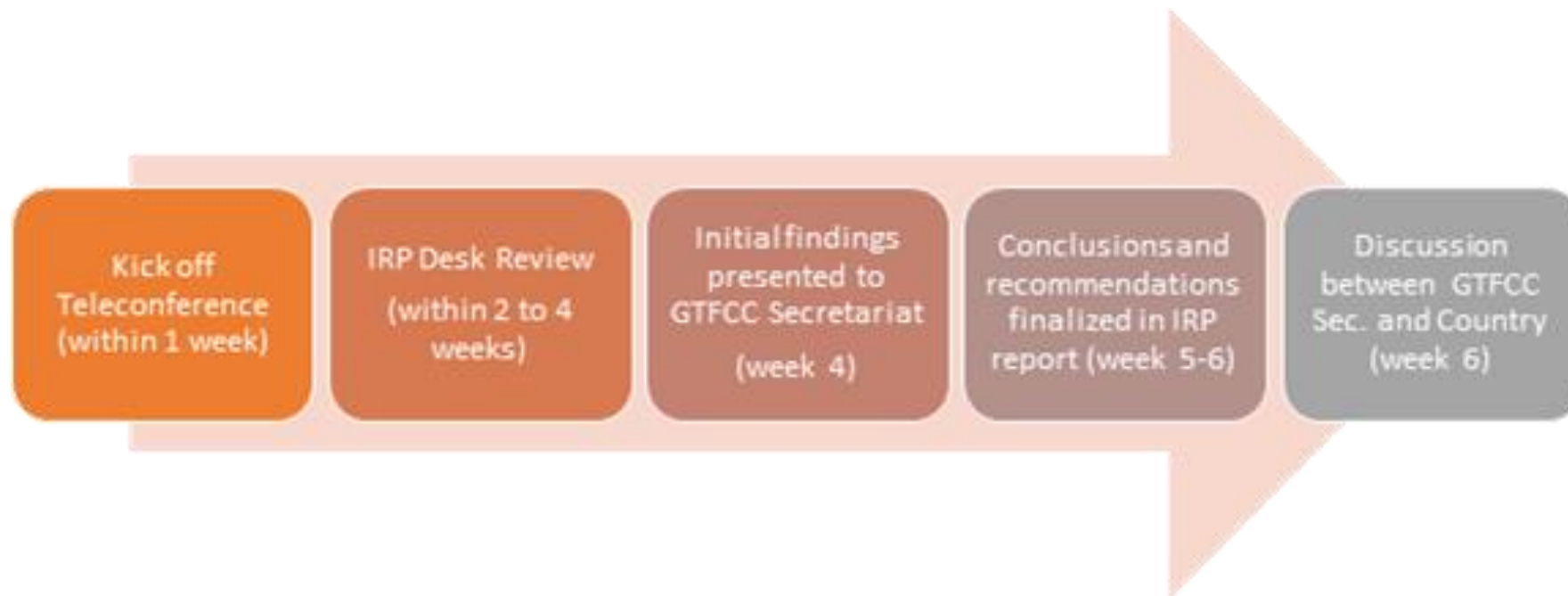

Collaborative process between GTFCC and countries



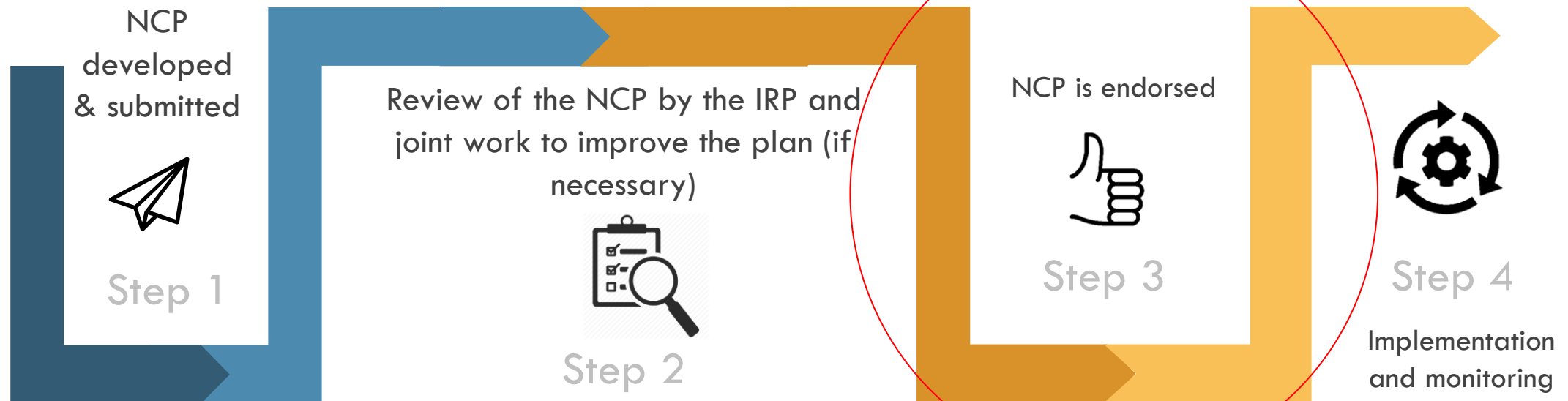
NCP REVIEW PROCESS

THE CRITERIA FOR NCP ENDORSEMENT

PRIMARY CRITERIA



Engagement of all actors in **the multi-sectoral approach** of the Roadmap



Completion of **the situational analysis** according to GTFCC guidance



Operational plans with activities and budgets for surveillance, patient care, OCV, WaSH, and community engagement.

SECONDARY CRITERIA

Detailed considerations on:

- Multisectoral approach and coordination
- Situational analysis
- Surveillance
- Management of care
- Oral Cholera Vaccines
- Water, sanitation and hygiene
- Community Engagement

COMPLETED REVIEWS AND PERSPECTIVES

Two reviews conducted since the launch of the IRP mechanism:

- Zimbabwe Multisectoral Cholera Elimination Plan (2019-2028)
 - Review conducted and completed in May 2020
- Kenya National Multi-sectoral Cholera Elimination Plan (2021-2025)
 - Review conducted and completed in January-February 2021

Perspectives:

- Multi-sectoral Cholera Elimination Plan Ethiopia 2021 – 2028
 - Review planned for June-July 2021 (start on June 14)
