KEY CONCLUSIONS FROM THE DISCUSSION

CHALLENGES AND GAPS

Technical challenge specific to cholera -> not only disease indicators but development ones

Funding gaps when it comes to M&E activities (e.g. funding stream to implement OCV campaign but not for coverage survey)

Roles and responsibilities: who is responsible for this at country level?

Dedicated Systems and human resources

Lack of guidance on M&E in each pillar

RECOMMENDATIONS

Clarify the objectives of M&E

- Primarily for country to assess progress and impact (they should be useful)
- Then build a global dossier of evidence (progress of the Global Roadmap)

M&E process should be flexible to achieve both objectives

- Adaptable to country context (e.g. conflict countries v. non-fragile settings)
- Ensuring standardization for the global level

Develop guidance on how to achieve M&E by technical pillar

Ensure that M&E framework is included in the NCP from the start (at planning stage) with implementing partners, roles and responsibilities, and resources required

Ensure that with the « toolbox » comes also the support to countries to implement M&E
