## **COORDINATED REGIONAL CHOLERA SURVEILLANCE** Significance

Outbreaks of cholera fueled by cross-border migration, environmental reservoirs, socioeconomic factors, climate change and political instability

Cholera control or free status in one country is unlikely to be stable unless all countries within connected regions aim to **prevent cross-border or regional spread** 

Strong collaboration and coordination between countries, sub-regions, and regions essential to progress towards cholera control and free status

# LANDSCAPE ANALYIS OF STATE OF PLAY

#### Findings

- High diversity between regions
- Stakeholders
- Level of routine implementation of regional cholera surveillance
- Operational mechanisms in place
- Resulting principles for strengthening coordinated regional surveillance
- Embrace diversity and build on existing mechanisms
- Goal ≠ harmonize operational mechanisms and process across regions
- Involve, engage, consult regional stakeholders

## FRAMEWORK Strengthening coordinated regional (cholera) surveillance

### Stepwise approach to help stakeholders develop a regional action plan to strengthen core missions in a coordinated manner

- Intended for stakeholders of Regional Organizations
- Builds on landscape analysis
- Structuring but not prescriptive
- Integration encouraged (applicable to a multi-disease approach)

## **CORE MISSIONS** Coordinated regional (cholera) surveillance

Monitor the cholera epidemiological situation and risk at the regional level

Develop, animate, and sustain strong regional cholera networks

Support countries to strengthen cholera surveillance







## MISSION: STRONG REGIONAL CHOLERA NETWORKS Develop & animate



Network of focal points & points of contact with strong communication mechanisms

Multi-directional alert/reporting channels





Regular meetings to foster continued engagement and direct communication

### MISSION: EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION & RISK AT REGIONAL LEVEL Monitor



•Collect timely national surveillance data at the regional level

•Analyze data with a regional perspective and disseminate regional level bulletins

•Assess risk for cross-border or regional spread and assist in coordinating preparedness and response activities

•Guide mid- to long-term strategies, including towards regional Cholera free status (rCfs)

## MISSION: STRENGTHEN CHOLERA SURVEILLANCE Support countries

• Assess and monitor country-level capacities



- Provide technical support accordingly
- Support **capacity building** for data systems as needed for the early detection and adequate confirmation of cholera cases, and the identification of **hotspots with regional implication**
- Support bi-directional **information sharing** between cholera connected countries

# STEPWISE APPROACH For strengthening coordinated regional surveillance

Phase 1 Self-assessment

- 1. Identify **stakeholders** and their roles
- 2. Jointly identify current **objectives and priorities**

3. Collectively assess the **state of play** for objective and priorities



Stakeholder checklist Objective and priority checklist Phase 2 Regional Action Plan

4. Define core objectives and priorities

5. Develop an **action plan** to fill gaps identified in self assessment phase

6. Develop monitoring and evaluation plan



Action plan template M&E template Phase 3 Implementation

- 7. Coordinate implementation
- 8. Monitor and evaluate

# WAY FORWARD



> Enlarge scope to supranational cholera surveillance (regional & global levels)



- Develop supporting tools for implementation, including
  - Necessary data and indicators based on objectives of supranational surveillance
    Surveillance governance and data access policy
  - Supranational epi bulletin/dashboard templates
  - Identification of cross border threats
  - Identification of regional "hotspots"



> Continue to actively engage regional stakeholders in this collaborative work



By 2030, cholera supranational and national surveillance are working hand in hand with cholera prevention and control teams to achieve and maintain a cholera-free world
