Hotspot mapping

- Nationwide Cholera Surveillance is conducted through 16 sentinel surveillance sites – 4 enhanced surveillance and 12 standard surveillance.
- EWARS ongoing Cox's Bazar

Ongoing activities in Surveillance


- Dehydration status of diarrhea cases at admission is introduced in DHIS-2 and web-based disease surveillance
- Consultant is getting hired for comprehensive Priority Area for Multisectoral Intervention (hotspot mapping) based on available current data

Oral Cholera Vaccine Requirement till 2024 in line with the NCCP

Due to Covid-19 and other factors, we got only 5.8 million doses between Feb 2020 to August 2022 in Dhaka ~3.3% of that was projected in NCCP

Priorities

- Develop Multi year plan for preventive vaccination campaign based on hotspot and in GAVI template
- Vaccinate migrant workers and pilgrims travelling during peak season
