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## 9<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Global Task Force on Cholera Control (GTCC) Working Group on Oral Cholera Vaccine

11 - 12 October 2022

### Purpose

The annual working group meeting aims to bring together members, countries, research institutions, funders, vaccine manufacturers, and partners supporting development, emergency response, and field implementation to strengthen the Global Taskforce for Control Cholera partnership for the OCV pillar, to review progress on WG priorities, and provide an opportunity for partners and countries to engage and collaborate.
