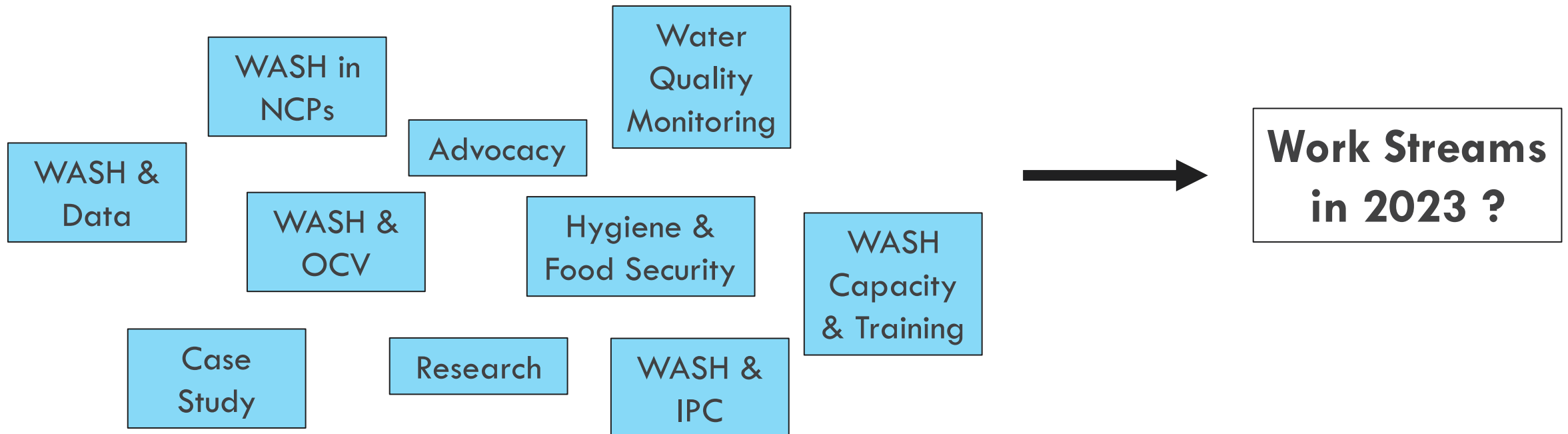

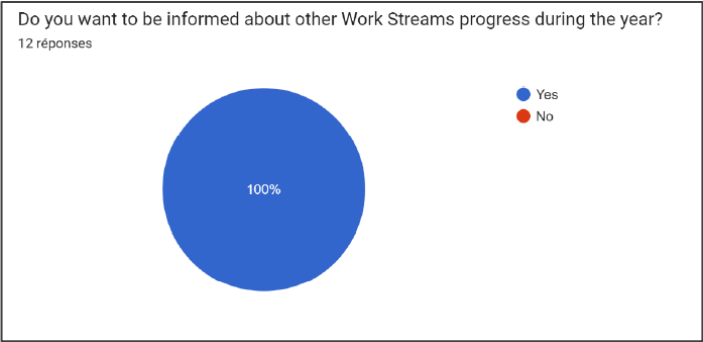

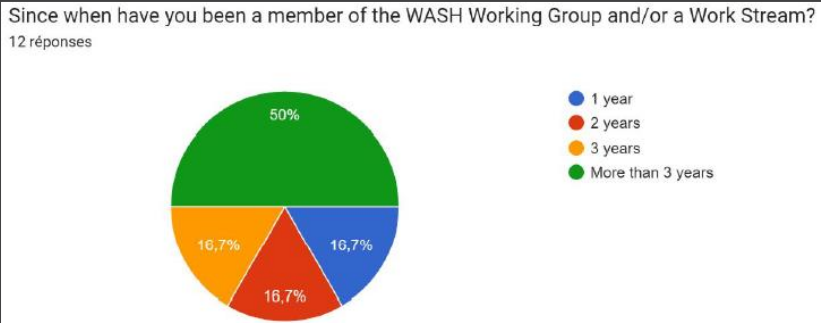
Past year

- No tangible outcomes



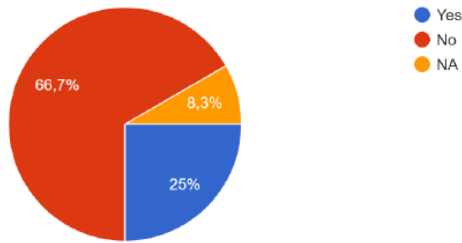
Willing for the future

- Willing to continue as members



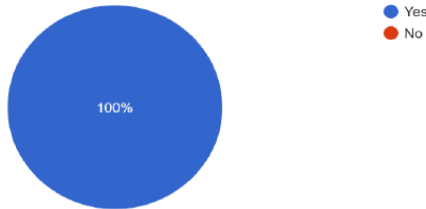
Was the number of meetings enough to reach the objective(s) of the Work Stream?

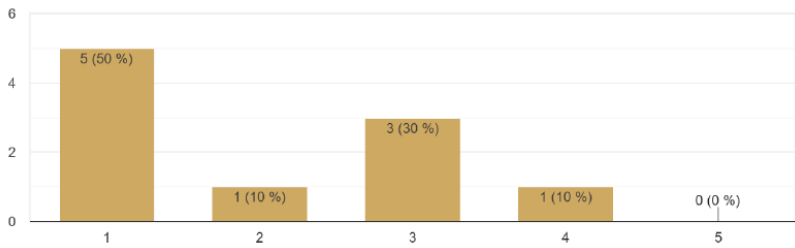
Do you want to be informed about other Technical Working Groups (TWG) progress during the year?

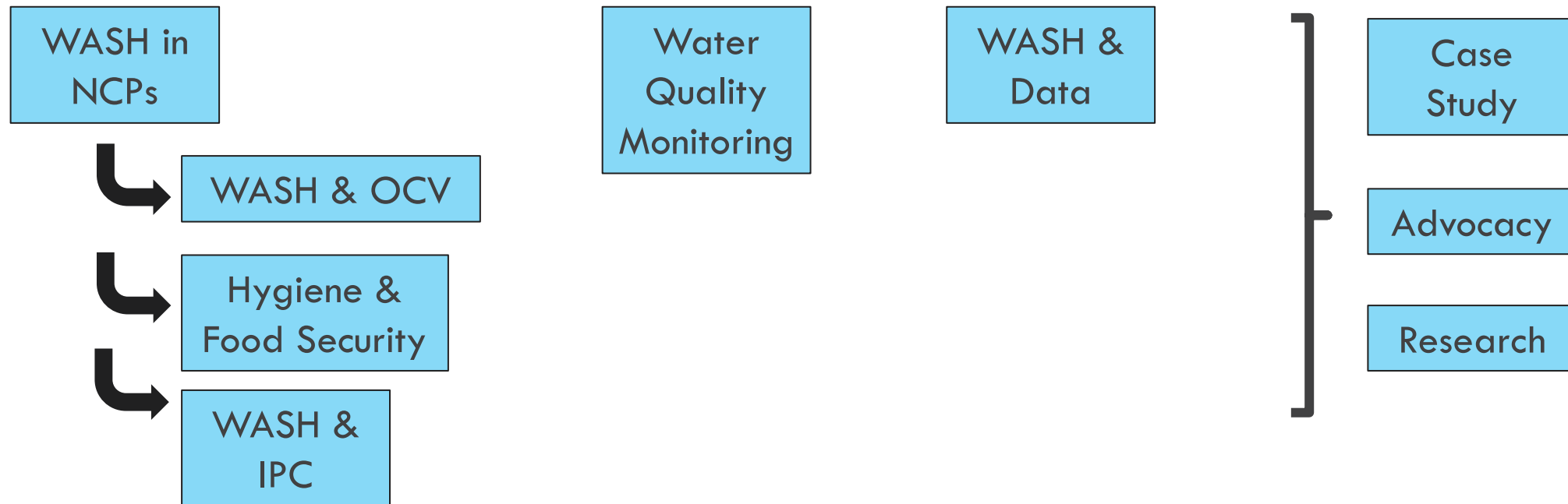
How was the interaction with the other Work Streams?

2023 WASH WORKING GROUP PROPOSAL

- Work Plan: focus on specific Work Streams (WASH in NCP's, WQM, WASH & Data).
- Integration of other Work Streams in the main Work Streams
- Trimestral meeting follow up open to each Work Streams
- Interactive platform (forum) for request (internally and externally)
- Refine the WWG vision – how we, as a WWG, can we contribute to helping the GTFCC achieve its goal (Roadmap)



TECHNICAL WORKING GROUPS TWG (PILLARS)

*The WGs provide the technical/scientific input and are composed of experts from partner agencies and independent members. The members act in their personal capacities and are overseen by an independent head appointed by the secretariat. **The WGs are tasked with advising on technical and scientific matters, covering all aspects of cholera control, developing tools and technical guidance, and providing technical expertise to the countries** (GTFCC RoadMap).*

Working Groups have been established in key areas of cholera prevention and control: (i) Case management; (ii) Policy and advocacy; (iii) Epidemiology/surveillance; (iv) Laboratory/ surveillance; (v) OCV; and (vi) WASH. The Working Groups meet on an annual basis, to coordinate activities and develop guidance documents. Support to countries is implemented on an ongoing basis, on all aspects of cholera control.
