






2023 WASH WORKING GROUP PROPOSAL

TECHNICAL WORKING GROUPS TWG (PILLARS)

The WGs provide the technical/scientific input and are composed of experts from partner agencies and independent members. The members act in their personal capacities and are overseen by an independent head appointed by the secretariat. The WGs are tasked with advising on technical and scientific matters, covering all aspects of cholera control, developing tools and technical quidance, and providing technical expertise to the countries (GTFCC RoadMap).

Working Groups have been established in key areas of cholera prevention and control: (i) Case management; (ii) Policy and advocacy; (iii) Epidemiology/surveillance; (iv) Laboratory/ surveillance; (v) OCV; and (vi) WASH. The Working Groups meet on an annual basis, to coordinate activities and develop guidance documents. Support to countries is implemented on an ongoing basis, on all aspects of cholera control.
