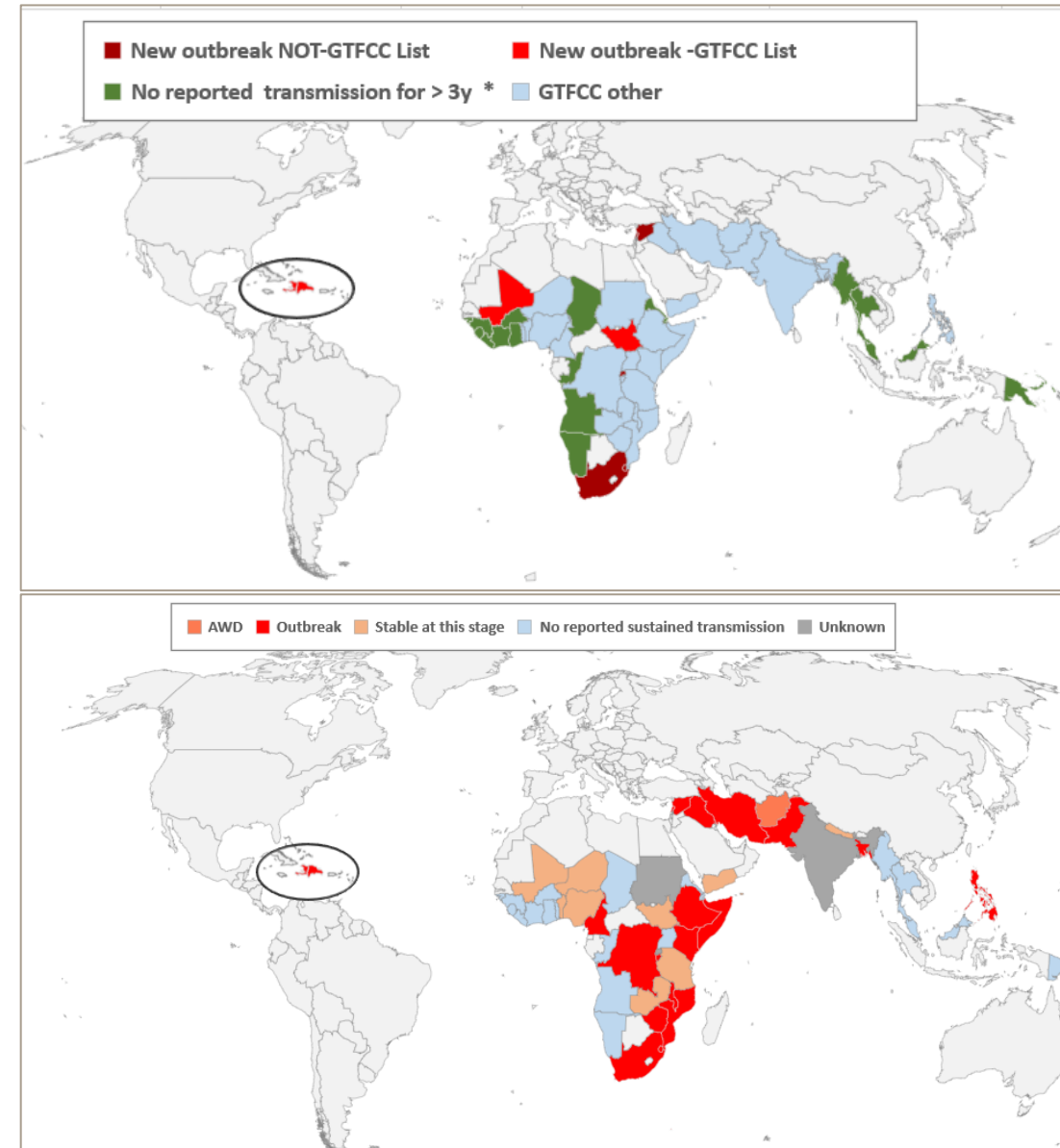

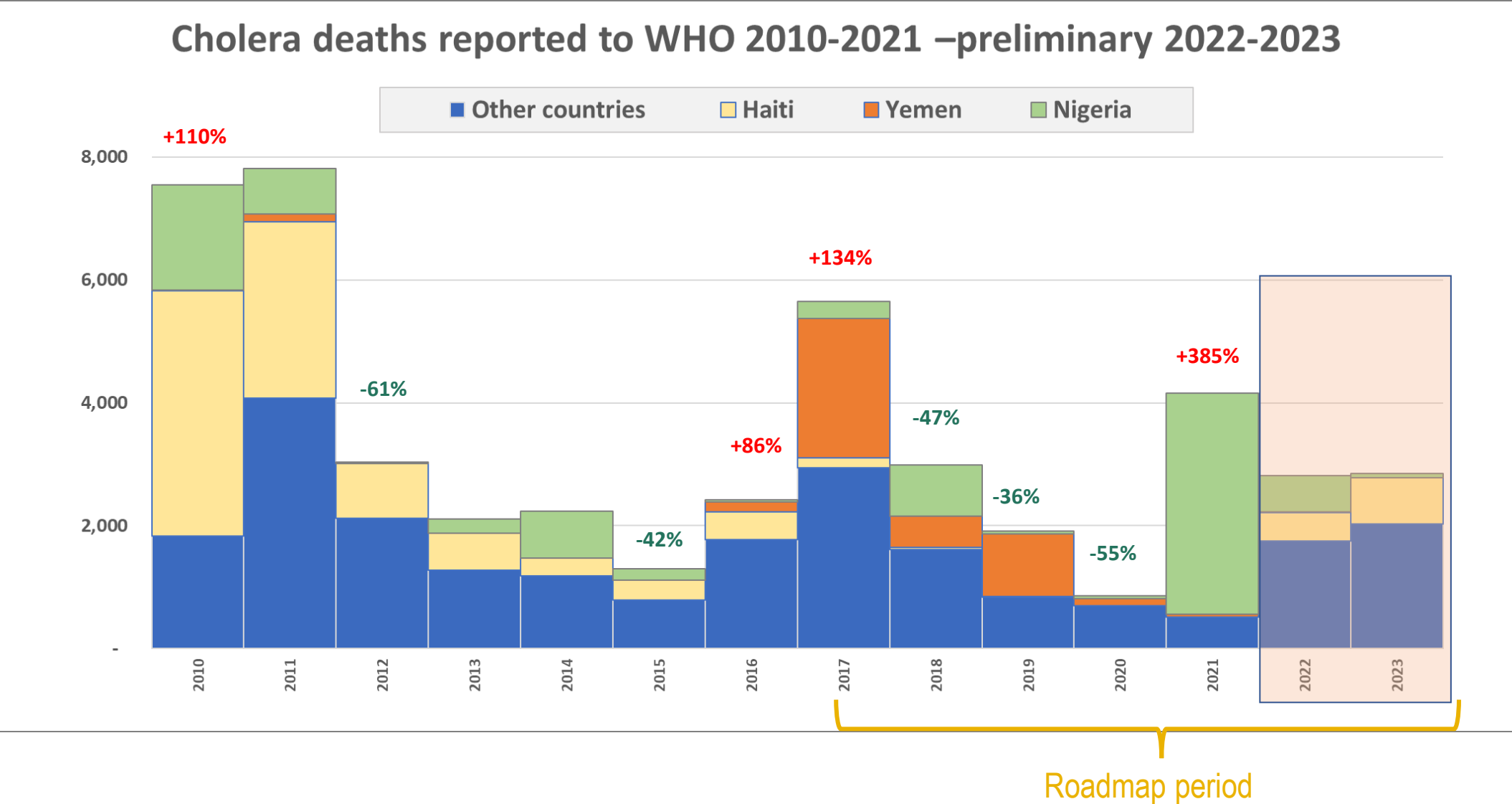
# Global cholera situation

- After years of progress since mid-2021 → **Surge of the 7<sup>th</sup> cholera pandemic**
- High CFR
- More and larger outbreaks
- New country **affected/re-affected after years** when not decade
- Classical factors continue to prevail (poverty, conflict, population movement etc.)
- 3 consecutive La Niña directly followed by El Niño
- First part of calendar year: usually a “low transmission” period



\* No reported sustained autochthonous transmission for more than 3 years (sporadic autochthonous cases not included) Based on information shared with WHO ; Subject to country reporting , Surveillance data not comparable across countries

# DESPITE EXPECTED YEAR TO YEAR VARIATION & LIMITS OF AVAILABLE DATA MARKED INCREASE IN DEATHS REPORTED TO WHO



# Global cholera situation: OCV

- One dose strategy still prevails
- 1<sup>st</sup> Semester 2023 → ICG requests (outbreaks only)
  - Number of countries: 15 requests (4 from 2022)
  - 11 requests in 2023
    - ❖ 5 fully approved
    - ❖ 5 partly approved
    - ❖ 1 rejected
    - ❖ Most submission pre-reduced due to OCV shortage
  - Gap estimated on submitted ICG request only & including 2<sup>nd</sup> dose
- Preventive vaccination
  - 17 M approved could not been shipped (no vaccine)
  - No New request in 2022 and 2023 (no available - doses)
  - → GAVI application opened

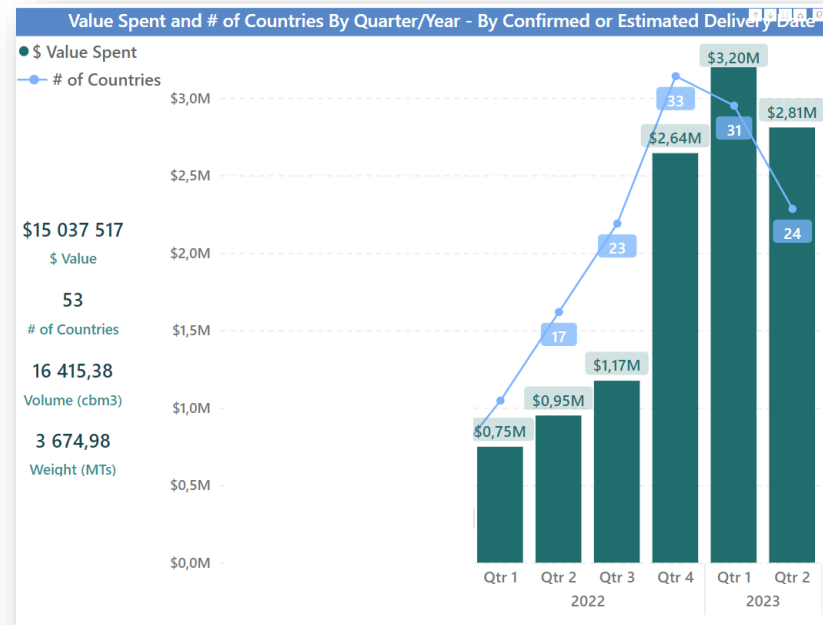

# Global cholera situation: Emergency Stockpile Preliminary 2022-2023 HQ

Shortage/challenges cholera commodities : IV fluids, ORS, Laboratory items  
Shortage Cholera Kits → Bulk delivery (challenging)

- 2021 bulk = 0%
- 2022 bulk = 3%
- 2023 bulk = 33%**

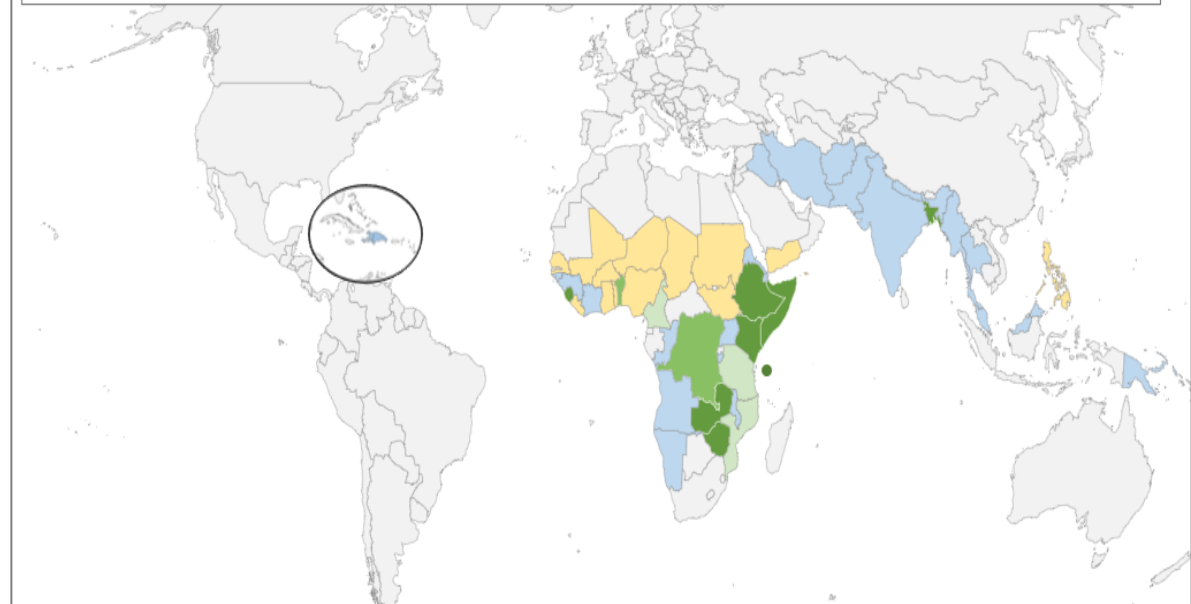

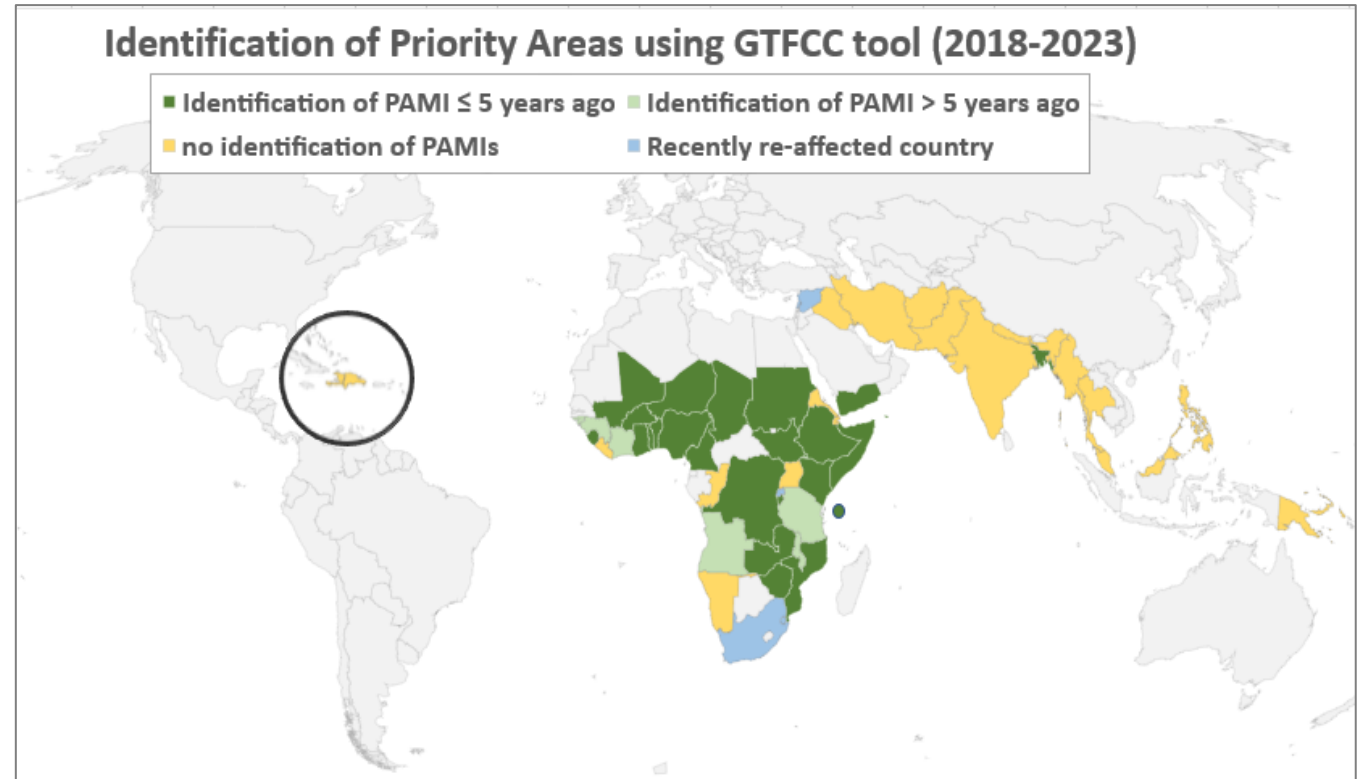

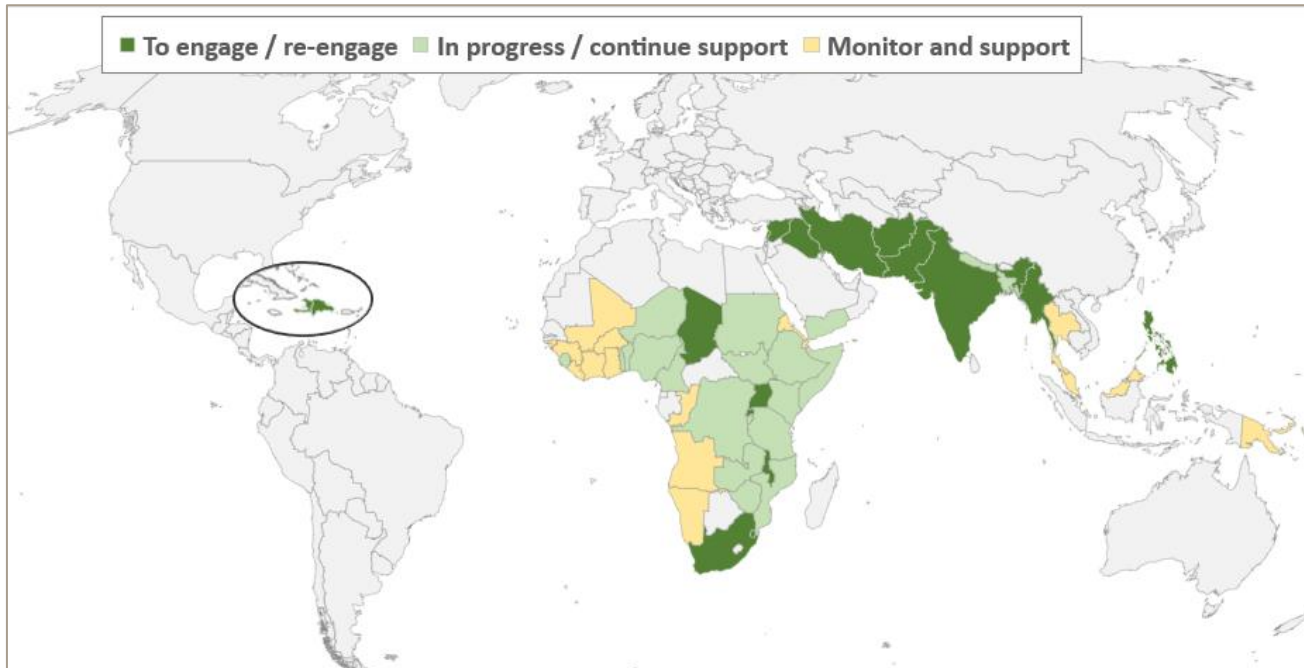

- $\sim \frac{1}{3}$  countries to **engage/re-engage** - **mainly Asia /Middle-East**
- $< \frac{1}{3}$  countries to closely **monitor** and support engage/re-engage - Africa

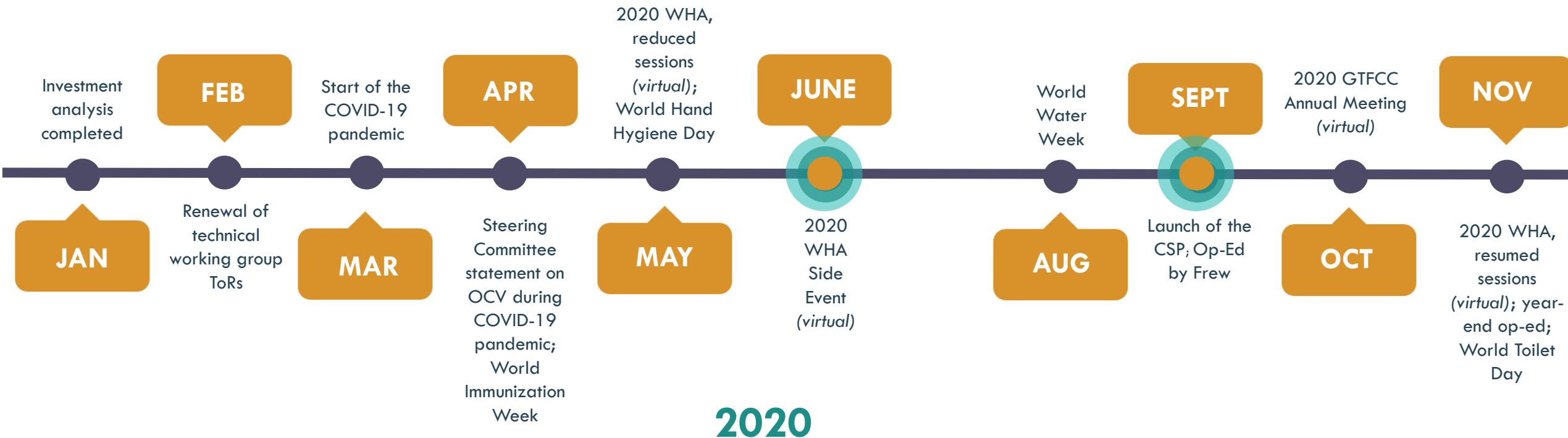

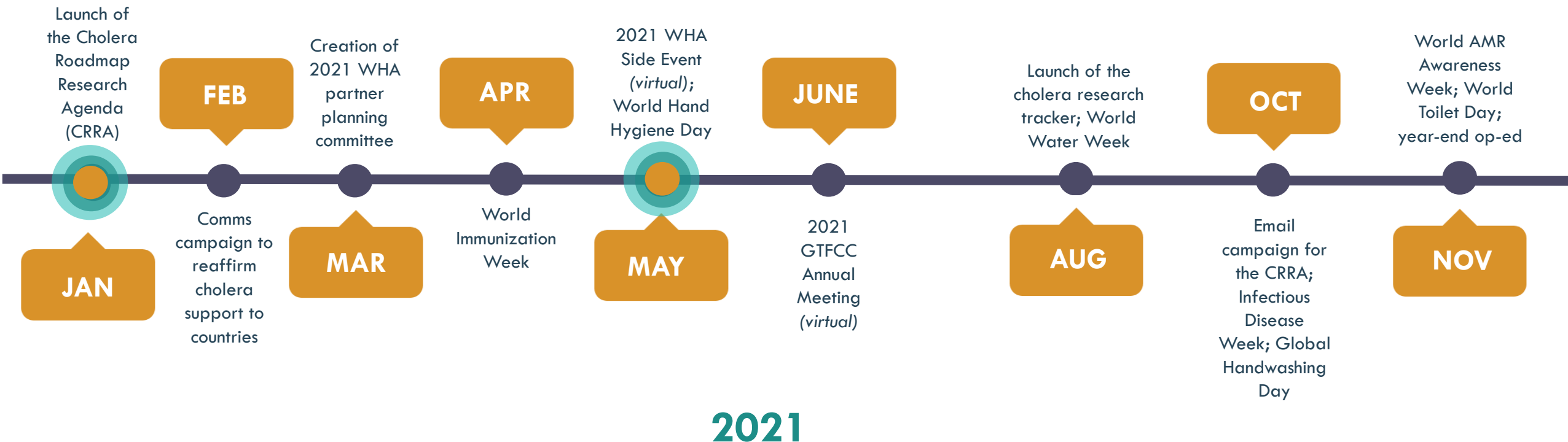

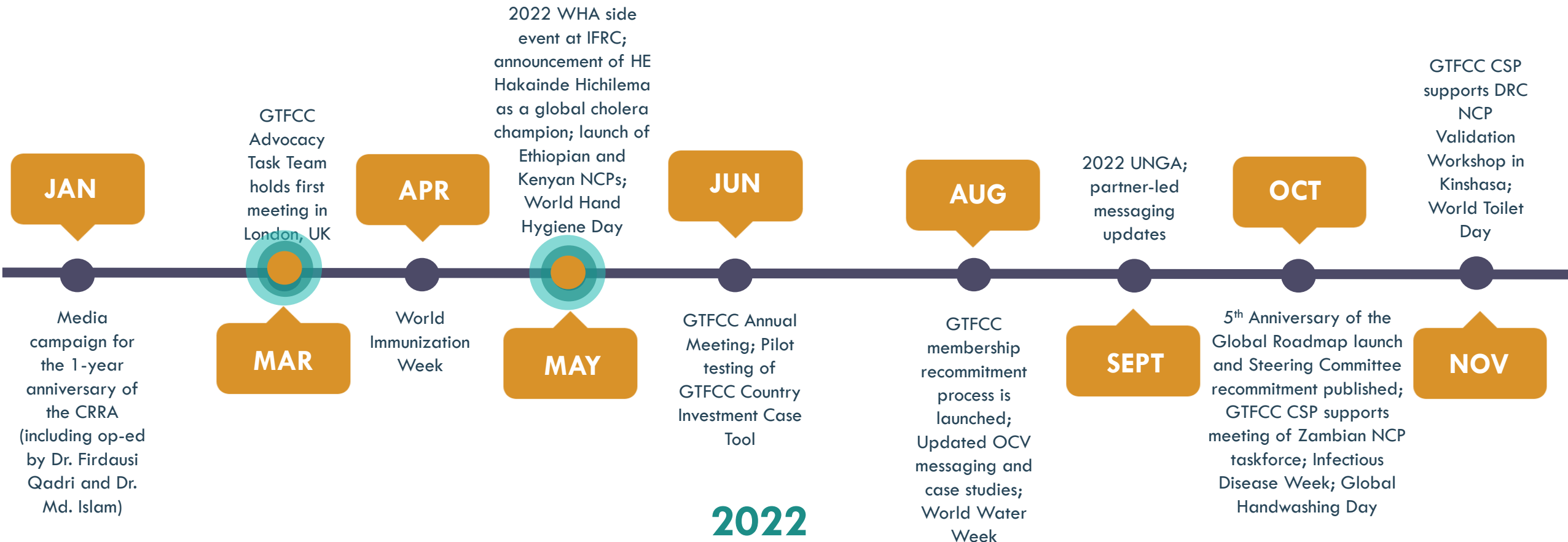

2. **“Look ahead”**: Develop a **logical framework** for the achievement of the Global Roadmap Goals, with particular attention to cross-pillar collaboration.

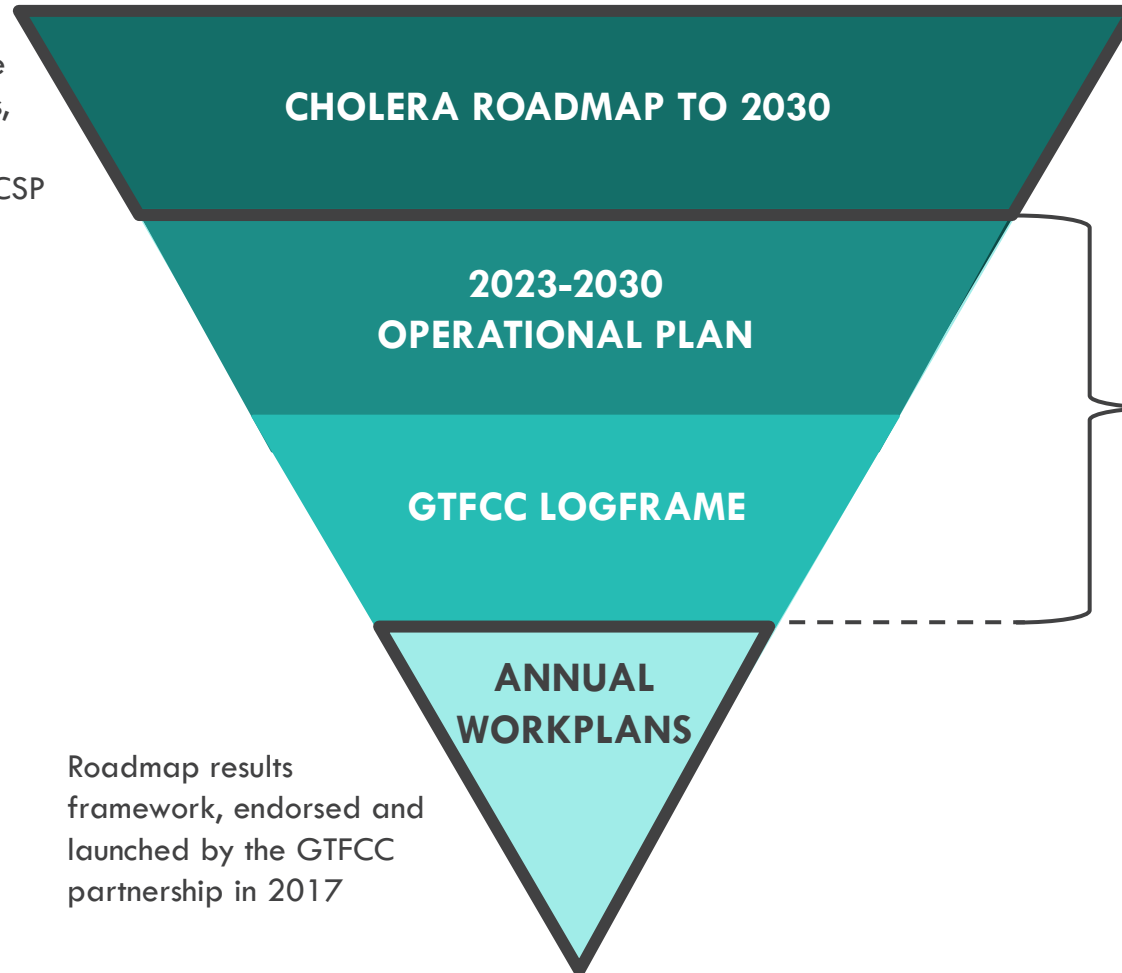

# Draft 0.0: Logical Framework for the Implementation of Axis 3 of the Global Roadmap

Axis 3 Objectives		Outcomes	Activities
3a. Coordination Mechanism	<b>Objective 3a:</b> Establish and maintain an effective coordination mechanism (including a Steering Committee, operative platforms and funding mechanism), with each body carrying out the responsibilities outlined its terms of reference (TOR) in service to the strategic objectives of the Roadmap Axis 3 logical framework.	<b>Outcome 3a:</b> The work of the partnership is fully coordinated at all levels, with each GTFCC operative body (including the Steering Committee, GTFCC Secretariat, WHO cholera program, Country Support Platform, Working Groups, Advocacy Task Team, and Independent Review Panel) are fully staffed/resourced to fulfill their respective objectives in the Axis 3 logical framework in alignment with their terms of reference.	<b>Activity 3a.1:</b> Conduct a baseline assessment of the functioning of the partnership and its operative bodies in preparation for drafting of the logical framework. (In progress) <b>Activity 3a.2:</b> The GTFCC Secretariat develops and hones a Logical Framework (in progress) and works with the GTFCC partners and operative bodies to coordinate its fulfillment. <b>Activity 3a.3:</b> Each of the operative bodies develop and hone their respective contributions to the Logical Framework. Financing	<b>Objective 3b:</b> Clarify the mechanism or pathway for financing to support countries to secure domestic and donor funding for their National Cholera Plans (NCPs) by cultivating new sources of funding and ensuring existing mechanisms prioritize cholera hotspots.	<b>Outcome 3b:</b> A mechanism or pathway is established and articulated to countries and donors to support the financing of Roadmap implementation in countries. Countries are supported to navigate this mechanism or pathway, resulting in increased funding for cholera control and prevention activities.	<b>Activity 3b.1:</b> Conduct a landscape analysis to understand the key donors and financing mechanisms for cholera control and prevention and how they might contribute to financing for cholera control and prevention. <b>Activity 3b.2:</b> Develop an articulation of the pathway/mechanism for countries along with guidance documentation on how to navigate this process. <b>Activity 3b.3:</b> Develop and execute an engagement plan for sharing the financing model with donors and other key stakeholders.
3c. High-level political engagement	<b>Objective 3c:</b> Facilitate and coordinate engagement of high-level political and governmental officers by leaders within the GTFCC partnership to ensure strong commitment at country level to creation, financing, and implementation of NCPs.	<b>Outcome 3c:</b> Ministerial and executive-level political commitment to cholera control achieved in focus countries, cultivating strong commitment at country level (and/or subnational level where needed) for the creation, financing, and implementation of NCPs.	<b>Activity 3c.1:</b> Develop a mechanism for coordination of high-level political engagement by GTFCC partners and champions, including policy asks and key messages. <b>Activity 3c.2:</b> Develop an annual political engagement workplan based on country prioritization. <b>Activity 3c.3:</b> Develop metrics for measuring political engagement.
3d. Country-level advocacy support	<b>Objective 3d:</b> Provide support to personnel from ministries and national cholera task forces as well as country-level partners to raise the profile of cholera in their country, mobilize domestic and donor resources, and cultivate strong commitment for the creation and implementation of NCPs and timely implementation of Axis 1 and Axis 2 activities.	<b>Outcome 3d:</b> Relevant ministries and country cholera task forces as well as country-level partners are supported and equipped to conduct domestic advocacy and resource mobilization, resulting in strong commitment for the creation and implementation of NCPs and timely implementation of Axis 1 and Axis 2 activities.	<b>Activity 3d.1:</b> Support countries in conducting country investment case exercises and capturing the results in a package of communications tools. <b>Activity 3d.2:</b> Following the launch of a country’s costed NCP, facilitate a meeting or event to socialize the plan with key donors at national and regional level in accordance with the established financing pathway.
3e. Country-level technical support	<b>Objective 3e:</b> Provide technical support and guidance to personnel from ministries and national cholera task forces to carry out objectives under Axis 1 and Axis 2 of the Roadmap across all pillars.	<b>Outcome 3e:</b> Ministries and country cholera task forces receive timely, high-quality technical support aligned to their needs and requests, facilitating the achievement the objectives of Axis 1 and Axis 2.	<b>Activity 3e.1:</b> Hold annual consultations with country representatives from each focus country to understand their needs and requests for technical support. (In progress) <b>Activity 3e.2:</b> Hold a coordination session in which partners commit to technical assistance for specific activities in specific countries for a given time period in collaboration with the Country Support Platform.
3f. NCP development	<b>Objective 3f:</b> Provide support and guidance to personnel from ministries and national cholera task forces to draft and revise their NCPs and establish a feedback mechanism through the Independent Review Panel (IRP) to ensure timely and transparent review of NCPs.	<b>Outcome 3f:</b> Ministries and country cholera task forces receive the technical support needed to develop and launch high-quality NCPs within a reasonable timeframe, with pillar-specific expert review and feedback conducted by the IRP, resulting in rigorous, complete, costed, and actionable NCPs.	<b>Activity 3f.1:</b> Conduct an assessment of the current NCP development process and IRP review process to determine where efficiencies can be gained. <b>Activity 3f.2:</b> For each country embarking on the NCP development process, appoint a focal point from the CSP or a partner agency to help support the process.
3g. Guidance development	<b>Objective 3g:</b> Develop technical guidance documents that are responsive to the needs of personnel from ministries and national cholera task forces to support the implementation of Axis 1 and Axis 2 of the Roadmap across all pillars.	<b>Outcome 3g:</b> Country cholera task forces and ministries have access to written guidance materials that establish norms and standards for cholera control and prevention activities that are responsive to their needs and facilitate optimal implementation of Axis 1 and Axis 2 of the Roadmap across all pillars.	<b>Activity 3g.1:</b> Hold consultations with country representatives from each focus country to understand their needs and requests for guidance documentation. <b>Activity 3g.2:</b> Conduct an assessment to determine what guidance materials exist, which need to be created or improved, and ensure they are accessible to countries and partners. <b>Activity 3g.3:</b> Coordinate across WGs to produce and disseminate guidance.
3h. Research	<b>Objective 3h:</b> Establish, update, and execute a Research Agenda to improve the effectiveness of Roadmap implementation across Axis 1 and Axis in countries.	<b>Outcome 3h:</b> A research agenda is established, updated and executed to support Roadmap implementation in countries, resulting in new data and understanding that enhance implementation of Axis 1 and Axis 2 activities in countries.	<b>Activity 3h.1:</b> Conduct an interim evaluation of the implementation of the Research Agenda to understand use, uptake, and execution against the identified priorities. <b>Activity 3h.2:</b> Identify sources of funding and technical support aligning to country requests for support in carrying out research.
