

Some key recent achievements

- Cholera App finalized and available
- > Scoping review: Risk factors for cholera mortality
- > Technical guidance:
 - Interim technical note on the treatment of cholera in pregnant women
- Updated Technical note on the use of antibiotics for the treatment and control of cholera: elderly identified as high risk group
- > Ongoing: ORP guidance and review of training material and jobs aids
- > Ongoing: Reyhdration in children with SAM review ongoing
- Ongoing: Use of antibiotics ongoing work of partners
- Data collection:
- New interim surveillance guidance
- Case reporting forms
- > Looking into future: novel treatments: phages, anti-diarrheal drugs, antibody-based products

Challenges

- Last in person meeting of working group in 2019
- > Multiple partners supporting outbreak response which limited time for WG
- Case management largely neglected pillar in cholera control little interest of donors limited resources

CURRENT WORKPLAN

Increasing access to treatment – Care in the community

- > Review of existing community models of care
 - ➤ How can these models be rapidly leveraged during outbreaks?
- > Development of guidance to set up and manage Oral Rehydration Points (ORPs)
 - > To be discussed during this meeting

Improving Clinical Management (reducing mortality)

- > Literature review on rehydration of children with Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) ongoing
- Review of treatment of dehydration in the elderly
- Continued work on use of antibiotics both modelling effects on transmission and prophylactic use

Improving data collection to identify high risk groups

- Improve data collection both clinical (patient records) and surveillance (with Surveillance WG)
- Reviews of recent outbreaks studies and retrospective data analysis
