#### **Purpose**

The annual working group meeting aims to bring together members, countries, research institutions, funders, vaccine manufacturers, and partners supporting development, emergency response, and field implementation to strengthen the Global Taskforce for Control Cholera partnership for the OCV pillar, to review progress on WG priorities, and provide an opportunity for partners and countries to engage and collaborate on OCV-related issues.

#### **Aims**

Through active discussions, the attending working group members will review progress of ongoing working group (WG) activities and OCV deployment, discuss and propose concrete actions to address current challenges, report on priority research progress and identify any additional research needs, and identify WG priorities for the next 12 months.
